





Maps are drawings of actual landscapes and places that use lines and symbols to represent real-life objects like roads, fields and buildings.






Key features of a map:




A title to show what the map is all about e.g. Road map of Sheffield.

A compass rose - shows direction to help the reader.

Different colours show important things such as green for forests and blue for water e.g. lakes, rivers, seas and oceans.

A legend/key – Objects and important things on a map are shown by symbols. A key helps us understand the map symbols.
